Protecting Alswell Farm

We want you to know about a new conservation project - the historic Alswell Farm. The Hanover Conservancy has just contributed \$5,000 to help protect the 50-acre property. Set on Wolfeboro Road in Hanover Center, the farm includes open fields, valuable soils, and the



headwaters of Slade and Monahan Brooks. Our friends at the <u>Upper Valley Land Trust</u> are preparing a conservation easement that will permanently protect the land for wildlife, water quality, public recreation, and future farming.

The Conservancy's gift comes from our Strategic Land Action Fund, created during our last capital campaign to enable us to help when such high priority lands become available.
