"January again, and...as cold as it is, the stars seem to be shining all that much brighter, as if whoever is in charge of celestial stokings, in pity at my shivering, has generously turned up the heat. The great pattern of winter spreads across the sky, from Capella high behind me to Sirius there in the south

"On this kind of night stars are so brilliant their light seems to become aural, the stars actually to chime - and then the sound descends, becomes rounder, turning itself into the familiar ring of the church bell across the frozen river in Vermont. A great horned owl, disturbed by this or pleased, hoots in the woods below the field's edge - one long sound, then, hesitating, a quicker second and third."
